DID YOU KNOW?

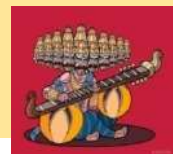
In the region of Bengal, people worship Goddess Kali, the destroyer of evil forces, during Diwali.

Ravana was an extra-ordinary Veena player.

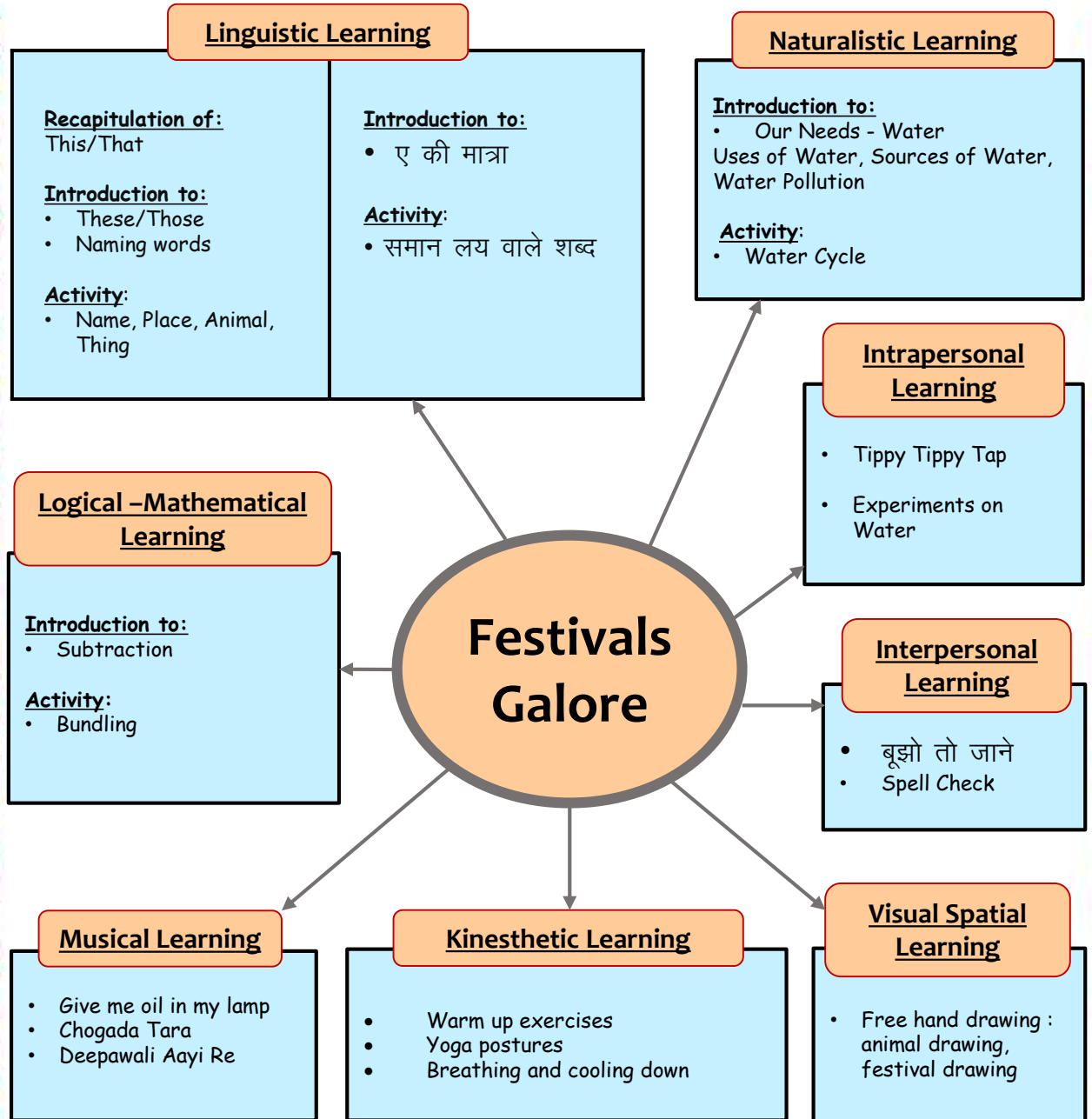


Dussehra or Vijaydashmi marks two celebrations in India: the victory of Rama over Ravana and the victory of goddess Durga over the asura, Mahishasura.
